

The Altar Stone







"With very few exceptions, the Altar-stones were removed in the reign of King Edward 6th and either broken, by which their consecration is at once destroyed, or used unbroken as pavement." A. Welby Pugin, 1868

The Eastern Orthodox counterpart of the altar stone is the Antimens/Antemension, (lower left) a cloth made of silk or linen with a small relic of a martyr sewn into it that is placed on the altar table. The Eucharist cannot be celebrated without it.
